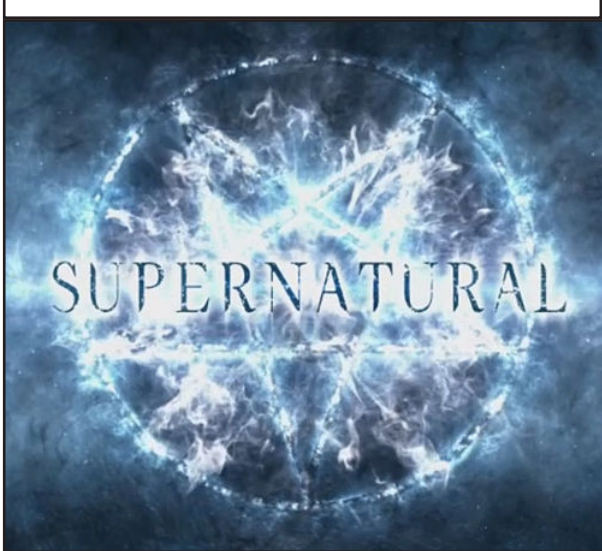

#### “Supernatural”

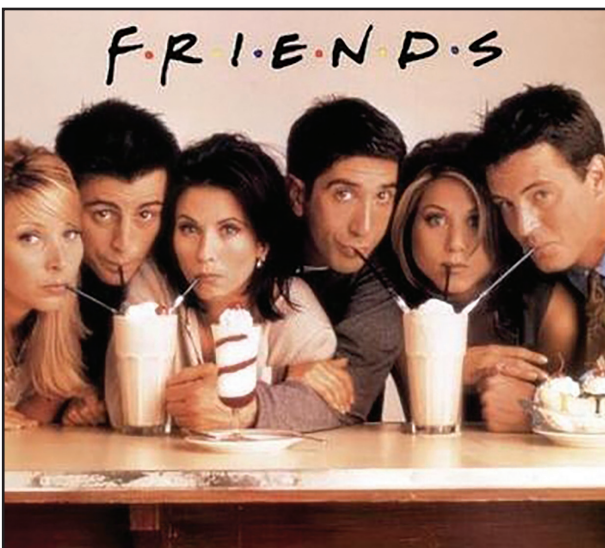

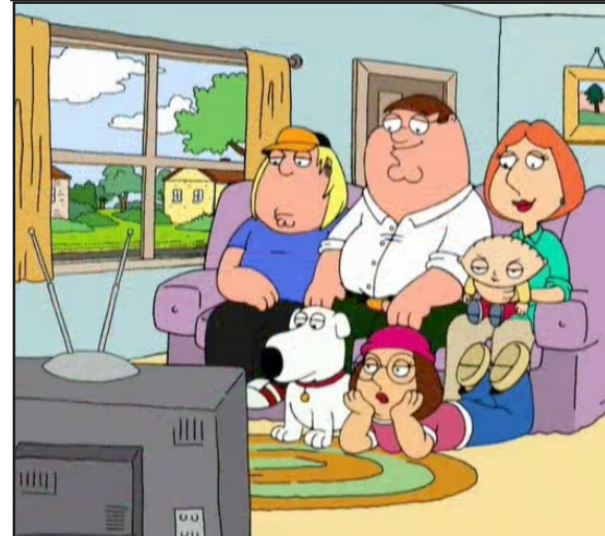
